2	Minimum Support Price	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> i. Farmers will decide MSP at cost of production + 50% (as recommended by Dr. M.S. Swamynathan and promised by Mr. Narendra Modi). ii. Government of India to provide balance of not realizing MSP.
3	Total Risk Mitigation Support	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> i. Gol to provide Insurance based on individual crop losses. ii. Gol to provide total reimbursement of losses due to calamities. <p>Gol to arrange market intervention fund.</p>
